This type of training will provide a valuable opportunity for the next generation of Korean Studies scholars to strengthen their research skills and, at the same time, enable them to build a network. It will also enhance participants' research by receiving feedback and mentoring from established international scholars in the field of Korean studies. The workshop is designed to facilitate discussion and cooperation among participants, allowing them to exchange views on their research and share their experiences.

Workshop process:

- (1) Each participant will be required to make a presentation (15 min.) of their current research.
- (2) Each presentation will be followed by a round of comments and discussion with the possibility to focus in depth on the key issues of the participants' research.
- (3) The workshop will be held in morning and afternoon shifts. A coffee break and lunch are included in the program.
- (4) Although it is indicated in the program that two professors will lead the comments and discussion, it is expected that the rest of the attendees will also participate.
